Exhibitors are responsible for compliance with DEFRA movement regulations in force.

The judges are instructed (a) to make the milking capacity and form of Udder one of the Chief Points in awarding prizes to cows and heifers. (b) to disqualify any animals with sealed teats. Certificates of calving to be produced where necessary before premiums are paid. In the case of a cow or heifer calving a premature calf, immediate notice must be given to the Secretary. Any cow or heifer entered in In-Calf classes which calves before the date of the show may be transferred into the respective In-Milk class.

Exhibitors will be permitted to tie up their exhibits in groups.

It would assist stewards if exhibitor could indicate number of animals to be stalled.

Livestock vehicle stickers/passes are valid passes for handlers travelling separately

Exhibitors will be allocated wristband passes according to the animals entered. 1 or 2 animals - 1 pass, 3 or 4 animals - 2 passes, 5+ animals - 3 passes. These must be worn at the gate for entry to the showground. Those not wearing passes will be charged for entry.

CONDITIONS - Basis of awards - Awards are based on a combination of production and inspection points.

PRODUCTION - Exhibitors must state on the entry form total pounds of fat produced from any three consecutive lactations of 305 days duration only from each animal with a minimum qualifying of 3.8%.

Yields of fat produced from the total of these first three completed lactations.

INSPECTION POINTS - The number of points gained for production by the highest yielder shall be taken as the maximum number to be awarded to the animal placed first on inspection. All animals to be placed and pointed entirely at the discretion of the Judge.

FINAL AWARD - will be based on a combination of production and inspection points.
