HORSE SECTION

INTRODUCTION AND GUIDELINES FOR COMPETITORS

ENTRY PASSES 2010 – Wristband, entry passes. Two wristbands will be allocated for the first horse entered, and one for each subsequent horse entered, upto a maximum of 4 wristbands in total. **To aid traffic flow the wristbands must be worn on arrival at showground. Anyone not wearing a wristband will be charged for entry. There will be no exceptions to this rule.**

PARKING – All light horse and show jumping competitors must park as directed by officials in the horsebox parking area. Please note there is no longer an ringside parking and all competitors must allow for this. To gain access to the ring all competitors must use the designated horse walk way marked at the show ground. Heavy horses will continue to park near the main ring.

START TIMES – Please look at start times for each section in the schedule. Some classes start at 9am. Please allow plenty of time to queue and park on arrival.

TIMINGS – Exhibitors may enter more than one class, but must ensure that timings of classes do not overlap. Under no circumstances will judging be delayed because of late arrival of competitors. Once judging has commenced late exhibitors will not be allowed to enter the judging ring. Exhibitors will not be allowed to leave the judging ring until judging is finished.

COMPETITOR NUMBERS – The numbers will be given out from the office in the horse box parking area (not from the main secretary's office). The office will be manned for collection of numbers from 8am until 2.30pm.

RIDING HACKS, RIDING HORSES, COBS - Classes are qualifiers for RIHS 2011. Riders and horses must be registered with British Show Horse Association. RIHS charge a levy of £7.50 per entry. This is paid by The Cumberland Show direct to RIHS. The novice hacks and riding horse classes are available for unregistered horses.

RIDDEN HUNTERS - Classes are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show 2011. Horses must be registered with Sport Horse Breeding GB and the riders and owners must be members. RIHS charge a levy of £7.50 per entry which is paid by the Cumberland Show to the RIHS. These classes are also qualifiers for the National Hunter Supreme Championship Show 2010. There is a ridden hunter class for non registered horses and riders.

HUNTER BREEDING – The Cumberland Show is affiliated to Sport Horse Breeding GB for this section and horses must be registered with them in order to take part. These classes will form part of the NW Sport Horse Breeding (GB) Points competition and Brood Mare Premium.

IN HAND HACKS AND RIDING HORSES COBS - New classes added following Hunter Breeding Section.

WORKING HUNTER CLASSES – A RIHS qualifier class is included. Horses entering this class must be registered with Sport Horse Breeding (GB) and the riders and owners must be members. RIHS charge a levy for exhibitors in qualifying shows. The levy is £7.50 per entry and is paid by the Cumberland Show to RIHS.

NPS SILVER MEDALS – Will be judged in the Native Pony Ring after the Native Pony classes.

CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS – Champion horse from **CLYDESDALE, RIDDEN HUNTER, HUNTER BREEDING AND RIDING PONY BREEDING ONLY** will go into the Show Champion of Champions competition (Main Ring 2.45pm)

SCOTTISH MASTERS - This show is a qualifyer for the Scottish Masters to be held on 30th September to 3rd October 2010.

GRAND PARADE (Main Ring 3pm) — Champions, reserve champions and 1st placed competitors will take part in the Grand Parade if their section is finished in time. Other sections not finished will continue with judging.

RULES OF THE SHOW (SEE PAGE 3) ARE THAT THESE PRIZEWINNERS MUST JOIN THE PARADE. All competitors taking part in the Grand Parade **must gather in the empty in-hand showing rings.** They will be called forward in catalogue order and escorted to the main ring by a steward. Please listen for announcements from the commentator.

1st placed in each of classes 1 to 10 will receive vouchers kindly donated by WCF Country Centres (£5).

1st placed in class 6 will receive vouchers kindly donated by WCF Country Centres (£15, £10) **provided** the number of exhibitors on the day exceeds 3.

Champion of classes 7-10 will receive vouchers kindly donated by WCF Country Centres (£25)

CLYDESDALE HORSE SOCIETY SHIELD An engraved shield is presented by the Clydesdale Horse Society to the best yearling or two year old colt or filly registered or eligible for registration with the Society and not having won a shield before in its lifetime. The Exhibitor must be a current member of the Clydesdale Horse Society.

THE HAROLD RUSSELL SILVER CHALLENGE CUP presented by the exors. of the late MR HN RUSSELL for the best Clydesdale yearling or 2 year old bred by exhibitor.

THE CUMBERLAND AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY CUP for the best Clydesdale foal.

THE JS HARRINGTON PERPETUAL TROPHY presented in memory of the late JACK HARRINGTON for the best Clydesdale animal bred by exhibitor.

THE J&D CURR MEMORIAL CUP presented to the best Clydesdale animal of opposite sex to Champion All Clydesdales which are shod must be within the guidelines of the Clydesdale Horse Society.

Horses competing in Hunter Ridden classes 19-22 or Working Hunter class 55 can not compete in classes 12,13,15,16,17,18.

Classes 11-18 are qualifiers for The Masters. 1st 4 to qualify.

Classes 12,13,15,16,17,18 are qualifying events for the 2010 RIHS. Horses must be registered with BSHA and all exhibitors, riders and owners must be association members. Riders must be 15 years or older. BSHA Tel: 01462 437770

The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify, if first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward.

The three highest placed prize winners in all open affiliated classes will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic Supreme Classes at the National Championship Show on September 10th and 11th. The BSHA offer a Novice Amateur and Young Rider Rosette in each open class and a championship rosette for each section. Blue Chip Feeds Ltd will supply a voucher and Special Rosette to highest placed Amateur Home Produced exhibit in RIHS qualifying classes and they must contact Sarah Butler (sarah@bluechipfeed.com or 0114 2666200), (Maximum of one rosette to be won at RIHS qualifier per horse. Royal International Horse Show (RIHS) 2011

Classes 19,20,21,22 are qualifying events for the 2011 RIHS and only horses registered on the 2010 Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on the entry form and owners and riders must be members of the Sport Horse Breeding of GB Society.

The two highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at RIHS.

Qualifiers must enter RIHS 2011 directly.

National Hunter Supreme Championship Show

Classes 19-22 are also qualifiers for the 2010 National Hunter Supreme Championship Show.

Qualifiers will be contacted by SHBGB. The three highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at the NHSCS. No horse lower than 3rd in its class will qualify. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be a member of the society.
