RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE CUMBERLAND SHOW HOME INDUSTRIES SECTION

Entering exhibits to the show:

1. Exhibitors are limited to one entry per class in all sections (*EXCEPT Sections 5 and 6*)
2. Entries 40p, no entry will be accepted until the money is paid (*EXCEPT Junior section - all entries free*)
3. A large letter stamped addressed envelope **MUST** be enclosed with all entries for return of exhibitor cards
4. Any exhibitor having 20 paid entries or more will be entitled to a free admission ticket

Staging of exhibits:

1. All articles exhibited must be the bona fide handiwork of the exhibitor
2. All articles exhibited must not have been awarded a prize at previous exhibitions of the Cumberland Show
3. All exhibitors' names will be in the catalogue unless they state otherwise
4. No exhibits to be sent by post
5. All exhibits must be staged by exhibitors by 6pm on Friday 14th June 2019 (except Walking Sticks which will be judged at 9.30am on Show Day)
6. Whilst every care will be taken, the Society do not hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or detention of exhibits

Prizes / removal of exhibits:

1. The Judge's decision is final
2. Prize money will be paid out between 3:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m.
3. No-one will be allowed to remove exhibits before 4:45 p.m.
4. All goods to be removed from tent by 5:15 p.m. Goods not collected by this time are left at owners' risk
5. At the committee's discretion prize money may be replaced with vouchers

DOUBLE PRIZE MONEY

Ingredients

Cake

- 225g (8oz) very soft butter (additional for greasing tins)
- 225g (8oz) light muscovado sugar or caster sugar
- 225g (8oz) self-raising flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 4 large eggs
- 4 level tsp instant coffee, dissolved in 1 tbs boiling water

Coffee Icing

- 175g (6oz) soft butter
- 350g (12oz) icing sugar
- 4 level tsp instant coffee, dissolved in 1 tbs boiling water

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan/350F/315F fan/Gas 4. Butter and line the base of two deep 20cm (8in) sandwich cake tins.
2. Measure all the cake ingredients, except the coffee, into a large mixing bowl and beat together until smooth. Stir in the dissolved coffee until thoroughly blended. Divide the mixture evenly between the two prepared tins and level the tops.
3. Bake in the preheated oven for about 25-30 minutes until golden brown, shrinking away from the sides of the tin and the sponge springs back when lightly pressed.
4. To make the icing, mix the butter and sugar together in a mixing bowl and beat together until smooth. Beat in the dissolved coffee and divide into four.
5. When the cakes are cold, slice each cake horizontally in half, giving four layers of cake. Sit one base on a cake stand and spread with a quarter of the mixture. Continue layering up with cake and icing so you finish with icing on top and swirl to give an attractive finish.

Biscuits

- 170g Butter (at room temperature)
- 55g Icing Sugar
- 170g Self-raising Flour
- 155g Custard Powder

Filling

- 50g Butter (at room temperature)
- 100g Icing Sugar

1. Pre-heat your oven to 180°C (160°C for fan assisted ovens or Gas Mark 4) and grease a couple of baking trays with a little butter.
2. In a large bowl cream the butter & icing sugar until light and fluffy.
3. Gradually add the flour & custard powder a little at a time until the mixture forms a paste.
4. Divide into small balls (about a teaspoon-tablespoon per biscuit) and place onto your pre-greased baking tray with a bit of space between. Flatten each ball lightly with a fork.
5. Bake for 12-15 minutes until they appear dry on top.
6. Allow to cool on a wire rack. Mix the butter & icing sugar to form the butter cream and once the biscuits are completely cool, pipe or spread a little butter cream onto half the biscuits and sandwich together with the other halves.
