- 1 ½ level teaspoons ground ginger
- 30g self-raising flour
- ½ teaspoon baking powder
- 45g butter
- 45g golden syrup
- 2 teaspoons treacle

### Method:

1. Preheat the oven to 170°C and line a 18 x 28cm Swiss roll tin with baking paper. Roughly break the shortbread biscuits into smaller pieces and put into a food processor with demerara sugar, crystallized ginger and ground ginger, then blend until broken into crumbs. Reserve 45g of this mixture and put the remaining crumbs into a large bowl. Add the flour and baking powder then mix well.
2. Gently melt the butter, syrup and treacle into a saucepan, then pour this over the crumb mixture and stir thoroughly. Press the mixture firmly into the lined tin using a fork then spread the reserved crumbs over the top. Use your hands to press these into the surface. Bake the gingerbread on a middle shelf of the preheated oven for around 12 - 15 minutes.
3. Removed from the oven and cut into fingers whilst still warm, then allow to cool in the tin. Once cold cut through the original marks again and store in an airtight container.

- 2 tsp Golden Syrup
- 2 level tsp Baking Powder
- 5oz Rolled Oats
- 8oz Plain Flour
- 1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 6 tsps boiling water
- Pinch of salt

**Method:**

1. Cream fats and sugar until creamy. Melt syrup in the 6 teaspoons of boiling water and add to the creamed mixture. Add dry ingredients and mix well.
2. Roll mixture into small balls and place on a greased tray. Bake at 375F for 15-20 minutes until evenly browned. Allow biscuits to cool on wire tray.
3. Melt 3oz of milk chocolate and add 1oz of butter and beat together. Sandwich together.
