- 225g very soft butter (plus additional for greasing)
- 225g light muscovado sugar or caster sugar
- 225g self-raising flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 4 large eggs
- 4 level tsp instant coffee, dissolved in 1tbsp boiling water

For Icing:

- 175g soft butter
- 350g icing sugar
- 4 level tsp instant coffee, dissolved in 1tbsp boiling water

Method:

1. Preheat the oven to 180°C/160°C Fan. Butter and line the base of two deep 20cm sandwich cake tins.
2. Measure all the cake ingredients, except the coffee, into a large mixing bowl and beat together until smooth. Stir in the dissolved coffee until thoroughly blended. Divide the mixture evenly between the two prepared tins and level the tops.
3. Bake in the preheated oven for about 25-30 minutes until golden brown, shrinking away from the sides of the tin and the sponge springs back when lightly pressed.
4. To make the icing, mix the butter and sugar together in a mixing bowl and beat until smooth. Beat in the dissolved coffee and divide into four.
5. When the cakes are cold, slice each cake horizontally in half, giving four layers of cake. Sit one base on a cake stand and spread with a quarter of the mixture. Continue layering up with cake and icing so you finish with icing on top and swirl to give an attractive finish.

- 115g salted butter
- 115g icing (powdered sugar)
- Half tsp vanilla essence
- 1 egg

For Icing:

- 180g icing sugar
- 2 tsp water
- Raspberry Jam
- Glace Cherries to decorate

Method:

1. Cream butter and sugar together until lighter in colour, add the egg and mix. Add the vanilla essence and flour and bring it together, allowing the mixture to come together before turning out and bringing together by hand
2. Form into a flat circle and wrap with cling film then chill for 30 minutes. Next, roll to a 5mm depth, and using a crinkle edged cutter to create shapes. Bake at 180°C Fan for 10-15minutes until slightly golden around the edges.
3. Once cool, spread half the biscuits on the bottom side with raspberry jam then sandwich together with another biscuit. Sift the icing sugar into a bowl and add the water a little at a time creating a thick icing. Carefully dip each biscuit face into the icing and leave to settle. Decorate with half a glace cherry on each one.

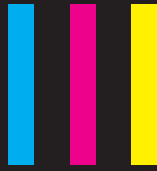
