



CUMBERLAND SHOW AGRICULTURAL SECTION RULES & REGULATIONS

MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership shall be open to applicants on the following terms; Minimum Annual Subscription £30, Annual Subscriptions to be payable on the 1st day of April, yearly Members and others may become Life Members of the Association. No Member is entitled to vote at a General or Special Meeting of the Association unless he or she has been a Member for fourteen days prior to such General or Special Meeting.

POWERS OF THE COUNCIL

2. The Council shall have the power of settling the Prizes to be given at the annual or other Exhibition, fixing the place of such Exhibitions, filling up vacancies in the Council of Officers of the Society, defining their Duties, appointing Stewards of Departments, making or altering Bye-laws and settling all other matters in connection with the management of the Society.

JUDGES

3. The Council shall appoint a sufficient number of duly qualified non-exhibitors to act as judges of Stock, implements, etc., whose reasonable expenses shall be paid by the Society.

STOCK

4. All animals exhibited must be bona-fide property of the Exhibitor, and must have been the property of the exhibitor, and in the exhibitor's possession on 14th May 2024 except when otherwise specified.

PROTESTS

5. All protests must be made in writing accompanied by a deposit of fifty pounds and handed to the Secretary not later than seven days after the Show except in the case provided for in the Premium list. When an animal is protested against or when the Council shall require him to do so the Owner shall prove correctness of the entry, or forfeit the prize awarded to him. In the event of the protest being unsustained and considered frivolous the above deposit shall be forfeited to the funds of the Society.

ACCEPTED PROCEEDINGS IN THE CASE OF PROTEST

6. In all cases of protest, the parties shall be summoned to attend together at a meeting of the Council, called to adjudicate upon the matter, and unless the party protested against can clearly show that the award has been made in accordance with the Rules and Bye-laws of the Society, the decision of the judges will be confirmed. Should either party refuse or neglect to attend such Meeting when summoned, without explanation the dispute may be decided in his or her absence.

DECISION OF THE COUNCIL

7. The decision of the Council upon the foregoing and all other mistakes or disputes shall be final.

VIOLATION OF RULE

8. If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Council that any Exhibitor has attempted to impose upon the Society by means of a false certificate or any other misrepresentation, or has wilfully or knowingly violated any of the Rules of the Society, he shall forfeit the prize or prizes to which he may be entitledand shall be prohibited from exhibiting in future at the discretion of the Council; and if a Member, may be expelled from the Society.

ENTRIES SECTION

9. All entries of Stock and Implements, shall be made on-line Competitors | Cumberland Show, a printed form can be obtained from the Secretary, and must be sent with all charges on or before the prescribed date. Entries will not be registered until fees are paid. A competitor may show more than one lot in any class. Any Exhibitor gaining a prize contrary to Special Rules and Bye-laws of the Society, or not complying with the requirements as stated in the premium list shall forfeit the prize.

LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED

DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

- 10. All entries of Stock must properly specify the full description of each animal by registration number, age, name and pedigree where requested.
- 11. The charges of exhibits shall be as stated in the Premium List.
- 12. Exhibitor and animal details will be included in the Show catalogue as entered.

EXHIBITORS' TICKETS, ETC

13. Exhibitors will be sent wristband passes according to animals entered. "Horse Number Cards" will be sent to exhibitors and such cards must be worn by rider/handler. Cattle and sheep numbers will be obtained from stewards. Corresponding numbers will be placed on stands which they are to occupy.

TIME

14. All animals to be in their respective stalls by the time stated on the Premium List on the morning of the Show and must remain until after the Parade. No animal or article shall be moved from the place assigned to it during the Show, under a Penalty of £20 for breach of this Bye-law, without the sanction of the Chairman of the Show Ground Committee or the Secretary except horses to be shown mounted, for which the exercise ring will be provided, all implements must be on the Show Ground not later than 8.00 am on the morning of the Show.

STOCK

15. Stock exhibited must not be distinguished, either in the Show Yard or Ring by the name of the breeder or owner, or any prize card (until after the prizes are awarded) except by the "Head Ticket" or number given in the Catalogue. All bulls above one year old must be secured and led by a ring with a chain or rope attached, or they will not be admitted to the Yard, and Exhibitors must lead their foals in the Ring when shown with dam. No animal may come before the same judge twice except when shown for a Group, Special, Championship Prize or in the Horse section. Only First and Second Prize winners are eligible for Championship Prizes.

STEWARDS

- 16. The Stewards of Departments are authorised to enforce all the regulations and conditions of the Prize Sheet as soon as the Judges in each case have their award, the Prize Exhibits shall be distinguished as the winners by the different coloured rosettes. The Stewards shall report to the Secretary the names of all persons who shall have failed to exhibit any of their stock entered for the Show or having infringed or failed to comply with any of the regulations or conditions, or have been guilty of any malpractice in regard to the Show, and shall have power to disqualify any animal which does not comply with the conditions of entry.
- 17. No steward shall officiate in a ring in which he is an exhibitor without the special consent of the Livestock Committee.

INSTRUCTION TO JUDGES

18. All Exhibitors and persons admitted into the Show yard shall be subject to the rules, orders and regulations of the Council. Servants in charge of Stock will be under the orders of the Stewards, and all persons in charge of animals must be in attendance at least one hour before the time appointed for exhibiting the animals in the Show ring and on parade. Owners of animals exhibited will be held responsible for the behaviour of their servants and for the consequences of any misconduct of such.

PARADE

19. A general parade of such animals and exhibits as decided by the Show Yard Officials shall be held during the afternoon of the Show. The Exhibitor of any animal or Exhibit absent from the Parade without permission will be fined £20 and in the case of a prize animal the premium awarded shall beforfeited to the Society.

LIABILITY

20. The Society will not be responsible for the loss or damage which any person, animal, dairy produce, implements, or other articles may sustain at the Show or in transit, nor for any charge for freight, carriage or delivery. Responsibility for insurance of animals and associated public liability lie with theowner and exhibitor.

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION (GDPR)

21. By signing the entry form, exhibitors accept that we will share their data, if necessary, with the bodies and breed societies listed below (and any other society not listed below that the Show has an affiliation to. Data will be published in our Show Programme, be on the Society's website and social media, and given to the local press with regards to the Show's results. Exhibitors do have the right to withdraw consent of this at any time by contacting the Show Secretary, secretary@cumberlandshow.co.uk or 07824 335315.

SAFETY AT THE CUMBERLAND SHOW

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

The Society intends to provide a safe and healthy Show for all concerned and requires that Livestock Exhibitors fully comply with their responsibilities.

Compliance with the Rules of the Society, H.S.E. Guidelines, Codes of Practice and Guidance Notes is arequirement.

In Addition:

- 1. Exhibitors must use the segregated areas for livestock movement, loading and unloading where provided and when requested to do so. Exercising must not take place within any public areas.
- 2. Compliance with HSE Guidance Note AIS35 Safe Handling of Bulls is required.
- 3. Children must not be allowed to have control of large or fractious animals and all animals must be kept under the control of a capable and experienced person or persons.
- 4. All Sheep must be provided with adequate shelter in the case of adverse weather, (Exhibitors to provide their own) Any exhibitor who fails to do so may be charged
- 5. All portable generators, power equipment and cables must be protected by a) self-earthing devices or a minimum 2 metre earthing rod and b) Residual Current Devices (RDC) set at no morethan 30 MA sensitivity. All cables and sockets must be adequately glanded for use.
- 6. The Society reserves the right to insist on immediate removal from the Showfield of any animal threatening the safety of any person or property.

MAJOR EMERGENCY

In the unlikely event of a major incident, return to your animals and listen carefully to any announcements being made.

EQUINE SECTIONINTRODUCTION AND GUIDELINES FOR COMPETITORS

Entry 2024 - Wristband passes. Two wristbands will be allocated to the first horse, one for each subsequent horse up to a maximum of four wristbands. Wristbands must be worn on entry to the Showground. Anybody without a wristband will be charged for entry.

Parking - All light Horses and working hunter competitors must park as directed by official parking attendants. To gain access to the show rings all competitors must use the horse walkways provided.

Start Times - Start Times - Please note that there may be some traffic congestion leading up to and on the show field, therefore please allow plenty of time to arrive and prepare for your class. A timetable with start times/or not before times will be available no later than 24 hours before show day on the show website and published on social media. Under no circumstances will judging be delayed due to either the late arrival of competitors or to accommodate a competitor in another ring. Exhibits will not be allowed into the show ring once the command for trot has been given (ridden classes) or judging has commenced (In hand classes).

Competitor Numbers - Will be issued in advance of the show. Please ensure you are wearing the correct number for each of your classes as detailed in the catalogue. Failure to do so could jeopardise your qualification.

Insufficient entries - The Committee reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes if necessary.

Prize Money - The society awards prize money 1st £20; 2nd £10; 3rd £5 unless otherwise stated. Where classes have 3 or less catalogued animals entered only first prize money will be awarded in those classes. Supreme In hand, Supreme Ridden Light Horse Championship & Supreme working hunter champion - To be judged at the end of the Light Horses Classes. The Society offers £75 to the champion and £25 to the reserve. The three champions will then be judged for the overall Light Horse Championship.

Champion of Champions - The Champion Heavy Horse, the winner of the David Allen trophy and the winner of the Margaret Ogden Sash will be eligible to compete in the Cumberland Agricultural Society Champion of Champions competition in the Main Show Ring.

The Showing Council Code of Practice for the Welfare of Equines - The Cumberland Agricultural Society adhere to the Code of Practice as set out by The Showing Council regarding the Welfare of Equines at Events.

Equine Influenza - In keeping with current Showing Council guidelines, The Cumberland Show Equine Influenza policy is as follows: Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Cumberland County Show. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 - 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an El vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites.

Trimming Of Whiskers - please be aware of individual society guidelines - for the avoidance of doubt within the unaffiliated classes the Cumberland Agricultural Society follow the showing society guidelines which state Sensory hairs are the hard hairs located on the horse's muzzle and around the eyes, also known as 'whiskers' that are used for sensation. It is recommended that horses should not have whiskers trimmed or removed (other than for veterinary purposes or with a vet's certificate). Mares and Foals should present with no evidence of whiskers or sensory hairs removed.

The Cumberland Show is currently affiliated to the following societies which may affect more than one section and competitors entering this show whether they be members or not of the society agree to abide by the rules of those societies:

BRITISH SHOW PONY SOCIETY (BSPS) - Affiliation No 432

Entries in these classes are open to all. The following classes are affiliated to the BSPS - 35 - 42 (WHP)

This show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS classes, whether or not members of the BSPS are subject to the rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.

LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW QUALIFYING CLASSES

The following classes are qualifiers for the London International Horse Show and this Show is affiliated to the British Show Pony Society (BSPS) and the British Show Horse Association (BSHA) and all persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in these Classes whether or not members of either society are subject to the Rules of each society including the disciplinary procedures and shall be deemed to have consented to their jurisdiction..

This show is a qualifier for the London International Horse Show Qualifying Classes. Only one pony/horse in each of the

following classes will qualify the highest placed (not already qualified) from the first THREE animals placed in each class will qualify. Non-members of the BSPS have seven days to complete their registration and membership to keep the qualification. If not, this will pass to the next exhibitor.

The BSPS Performance Coloured Classes are open to mares, geldings and CHAPS (UK) or BSPA graded stallions, 4 years old and over to be registered in and complying with the showing requirements of the main body of the stud book of the Coloured Horse and Pony Society CHAPS (UK) or the British Skewbald and Piebald Association (BSPA). Ponies can be registered with either of these Societies or the BSPS and owners and riders must be or become members within 7 days of the BSPS to take the qualification.

BSHA Rising Star

Eligibility For The Class

No Rider or Owner who falls within the following criteria may compete on or enter an animal in Rising Star classes IF THEY:

- Receive financial remuneration or other rewards, produces(ed), teaches, rides or schools SHOW riders or horses or ponies for the SHOW ring. These rules relate solely to SHOWING, those involved in other equestrian disciplines remain eligible, including equestrian retailers, riding school and livery owners or employed staff, those who break and school for other disciplines, unless remuneration is received for professional training or riding services at an affiliated equine level (BD, BS, BE).
- No rider may qualify more than one animal in each section.
- Appear on any showing judges panel for affiliated show organisations, or societies.
- Are a Professionally Produced Amateur (horse stabled in livery with a Showing Professional).
- Appear on any social media sites, any electronic sites or publications as a promotional 'Brand Ambassador' for a company, or receive benefits whether monetary or 'gifted'.
- Have previously been CHAMPION in any LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London ExCel.

OPEN TO:

- Horses which have never been placed in the top 9 in any class at Horse of the Year Show Finals (not including SFAS or SEIB R2R Final).
- Riders not to have competed in any classes at Horse of the Year Show in the two previous seasons (2022 & 2023) (not including SFAS or SEIB R2R Final).
- Riders not to have been placed in the top 9 in any classes at Horse of the Year Show Finals in the current season (2024).
- Horses which have not been placed in the top 5 in any OPEN class at the Royal International Horse show (this excludes the current season).

RISING STAR RULES 2024

GENERAL RULES:

- Competitors do not have to be members to compete in the direct qualifiers, however all competitors who receive their qualification to the LIHS BSHA Rising Star Supreme Final must complete their membership and registration with the BSHA within 14 days for their qualification to stand or this will pass down to the next eligible exhibit.
- No Competitor previously deemed a showing Professional or Producer may be permitted to enter these classes.
- No Judges from any affiliated Associations or Societies may act as part of a 'support team' and enter the ring to 'groom' for any competitor or offer verbal ringside assistance at the Finals.
- Any competitor who has previously been disqualified from the series will not be allowed to compete within the series again.
- Riders should be suitably mounted at all times, this includes appropriate use of tack, spurs and whips whilst part of any qualifying process or part of the Final.
- Horses must be worked in by the Rider that will compete on the Horse in the Competition.
- The BSHA shall publish a list of all qualified riders and horses on their website throughout the season, which will be available on the BSHA website (www.britishshowhorse.org). All complaints regarding eligibility for the Series must be received by Friday 18th October 2024 from Members only. After this date NO OTHER COMPLAINTS WILL BE ACCEPTED BY THE ASSOCIATION OR ANY PARTNERS OF THE LONDON INTERNATIONAL HORSE SHOW.
- All horses competing at the Final MUST BE FULLY VACCINATED to fit rules and regulations of the London International Horse Show without exception.
- The BSHA Office will only enter into correspondence relating to qualification, with those who are both Rising Star finalists and BSHA members.
- Transfer of qualification of Horse is allowed as long as the new owner and or rider fulfills the eligibility for the class.
- JMB certificates will not be required to compete in these classes.
- No Stallions are eligible to take part in any Rising Star classes.
- No rider under 15 years of age is eligible to compete in classes Affiliated to the Association. Proof of age may be required.
- The Judge will NOT ride exhibits in these classes.
- The Judges decision is final.

Classes that qualify for BSHA Rising Star Supreme Finals at the London

International Horse Show will allow the highest placed unqualified horse in top 5 to qualify. If classes are amalgamated each highest unqualified horse of each section will qualify. A levy of £10.00 per class is included in the entry fee, which the Cumberland Show pays directly to the LIHS.

Coloured Horse & Pony Society (CHAPS) UK - Affiliation -037

This show is affiliated to The Coloured Horse & Pony Society (UK). Affiliation No -037. Both owner and the rider/exhibitor need not be a member of CHAPS (UK) nor must the horse or pony be registered with CHAPS (UK) to compete. However in order to Qualify both Owner and Rider/Exhibitor need to be a current showing member and present their valid Qualifier

card IN THE RING for signing by the judge. Members to apply in writing to CHAPS (UK) for appropriate qualifier card. The CHAPS (UK) Championship Show will be held on 15th to 17th August 2024. The following classes are CHAPS (UK) Qualifiers (Classes). (CHAPS registered animals in classes, Sport Horse class and in the Veteran section classes may also qualify. For full rulings and information on competition/qualification, please refer to the CHAPS (UK) Members 'Handbook; or visit www.chapsuk.com for rulings. Only 'coloured' horses & ponies (as defined in the current CHAPS UK members' handbook) may compete these classes.

All stallions, 4 years old and over entering these classes must be graded with CHAPS (UK). All stallions must wear Stallion ID Discs in the ring without exception.

Northern Counties Ponies Association (NCPA) - Affiliation No 254/24

This show is affiliated to the Northern Counties Pony of the Year Show September 2024 to be held at Warren Farm EC, Formby L37 0AN on the 1st September 2024. 1st & 2nd prize winners in appropriate classes will qualify. The Supreme and Reserve In Hand & Ridden Champions will qualify for the NCPA GOLDEN SUPREMES.

National Pony Society (NPS) - Affiliation No S5.120

This show is affiliated to the NPS - entrants do not need to be members of the NPS to compete. The following classes are affiliated to NPS (Part bred Arab) (Shetland Ponies), (Fell Ponies), (IH and Ridden M & M's), and , and (Show Ponies and Show Hunter Ponies).

NPS Qualifying Rounds

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register. Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 6th to 8th August 2024. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

NPS/CORSCARON HORSE ESSENTIALS Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 6th to 8th August 2024.

Retraining of Racehorses (RoR)

Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifier - Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree on. All entries MUST have current RoR competition registration and have RACED in GB. The class will be under rules of RoR. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. To take part in this class, horses must NOT have won a ridden open class under any affiliated showing society (inc. SEIB/HOYS, BSHA, SHB(GB) BSPS, BSPA, Tattersalls RoR Open Show Series Qualifier, TARRA Ridden, RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier or any other open class except Tattersalls (TBA) RoR Challenge Show Series or other Working Hunter type classes. Unaffiliated Show wins are not taken into account. Horses WILL be ridden by the judge. Horses will be stripped for conformation. Horses may remain in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series (formerly RoR Jockey Club Novice Show Series) classes until they have won (win) three Tattersalls RoR Novice Show Series Qualifiers. They are de-noviced on their third novice win or at midnight on the day they win an open class, whichever happens first. They are still eligible to compete in the Tattersalls RoR Novice Final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes are NOT ignored in this series. RoR prizes will not be awarded to RoR qualifiers with numbers forward of two or less, however qualification for the final will stand. Prizes - Rosette 1st -4th

The Tattersalls RoR Scottish Open Show Series Qualifier 2024 - Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4years old or over, any height. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2024. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited. The first three go forward to the championship at the Royal Highland Show 2025. In the event that the first three are already qualified, the qualification will go down the line to fourth. All entries MUST have current competition registration with the RoR and have RACED in GB. There will be a prize for the highest placed veteran 15 years or over. The class will be run under the rules of RoR. Horses to be ridden by the judge. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite

mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series. Prizes Rosettes 1st to 4th place and Vouchers 1st to 3rd place: 1st £40, 2nd £30, 3rd £20. Veteran prize, £20 voucher to be redeemed from RoR office and qualification for the Veteran final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships, Aintree, August 2024.

RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2024 - Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored. Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a Bitless/In Hand Bridle. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force. Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with chinstrap. This class is a qualifier for the RoR OPEN In Hand Showing Series FINAL. The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on August 2024. 1st - 4th. Prizes - 1st £30, 2nd £20, 3rd £10

Horse & Country Racing (HCR) - The Horse & Country Racehorse Series - The Horse & Country Racehorse series is open to Thoroughbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. The judge will not ride and you will be not asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show.

EXMOOR PONIES

All Exmoor Ponies must be registered in Section 1 of the Exmoor Pony Society Stud Book. All competing Exmoor pony stallions (In Hand, Ridden, WHP etc) aged 4 yrs and over should be licensed with the Exmoor Pony Society.

Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society

This show is affiliated to SPSBS, NPS & SSPC for Shetland pony classes. Please note the following information.

Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

To enter a stallion in ANY class (in-hand or performance) at an affiliated show, entire males aged 4 years old and over must have an "S" number and have been successfully through either the SPS-BS Stallion assessment prior to 2006 or the current SPS-BS Voluntary Veterinary Examination. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.

There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Young Handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or Stallions in In-hand classes. Children aged under 12 years old on the day of their class may not show a stallion in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. For Health & Safety purposes judges and exhibitors must remain standing whilst in the ring when showing ponies. KNEELING IS NOT PERMITTED. Hard hats conforming to current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden Classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA) - Affiliation No

TOYS In hand & ridden classes qualifying Classes. No known breeding required to enter these classes. No membership required to enter these classes. TGCA Breed classes are qualifiers for the Best of Breed Finals at the Traditional Gypsy Cob Association's (TGCA) National Breed Championship Show "TOYS". Traditional Classes are open to all traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the Traditional Finals at "TOYS". Part Bred Classes are open to all part bred traditional gypsy cobs and are qualifiers for the part bred finals at "TOYS". The exhibit must have one parent that is a traditional gypsy cob. Stallions - All stallions in order to enter any TGCA affiliated class MUST be TGCA registered, have passed TGCA stallion evaluations and their TGCA stallion disc displayed on their bridle. Stallions and colts over the age of two, MUST be shown in a stallion bridle with a metal bit and chain lead as per the current TGCA rulebook. Current TGCA members must present their Membership card and Qualification card to the judge in the ring for signature. Non-members MUST receive a qualification card from the judge and have 21 days to join the TGCA and register their horse to validate the qualification. Please refer to www.tgca.co.uk for further details including membership, horse registration and showing rules (contained within the members handbook).

Championships: Quest for a Star Championship inc Youngstock Quest got a Star - Traditional Gypsy Cobs - 1st, 2nd and 3rd from the TGCA classes 101 - 107 above may go forward to the Quest for a Star Championship as per below rule. ONLY current TGCA members and horse/pony that is already TGCA registered can exhibit in this championship. If an exhibit already has their Quest for a Star Qualification for that particular section, they should stand aside to allow members that have not yet qualified come forward for qualification. Membership card and Members qualification card (specific to that exhibit) must be presented upon entry into the ring. The Champion and Reserve qualify for the Ultimate Star Championships at TOYS. The Greatest Gelding Award - Traditional Gypsy Cobs - The award is aimed to encourage the showing of geldings, therefore creating a market for often unwanted colt foals and enabling the creation of a network of potential performance prospects to represent the best Traditional Gypsy Cob breed in the World at the highest level. This award should be given to the highest placed registered Traditional Gelding.

Veteran Horse Society (VHS)

An Area qualifier is the first of the three rounds in the Veteran Horse Society showing series. Competitors placed 1st to 4th at an Area Qualifier are then eligible to enter a Regional Final (second round) providing they become a member.

Competitors then placed 1st or 2nd at a Regional Final gain qualification to the VHS Supreme Final to be held at Arena UK, Lincolnshire on 30th August - 1st September 2024.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st April each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged. See VHS website for schedule.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, 30th August - 1st September 2024. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid season in 2024. For further information please visit the VHS website www.veteran-horse-society.co.uk or telephone the VHS Show Office on 01239 881300 or 07789 514004.

The Showing Register (TSR)

Qualifier for TSR NAF Five Star Showing Finals - This show is a qualifier for the TSR NAF Five Star Showing Finals. All In Hand & Ridden classes are qualifiers. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals! The 4 highest placed handlers/riders will qualify in each class. Competitors MUST have their qualification record sheet signed by judge/steward/secretary, record sheets are available FREE from the TSR website. Full details at https://www.theshowingregister.co.uk






